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Adult Health Record

The following tables can be used to record basic data and procedure information that pertain to an individual animal. Table #1 is for recording information about the animal when it is healthy. This data should be taken while the animal is AT REST, at different times, and on different days. After several days of recording this information, an average for the animal can be calculated. When problems arise, use the physical exam sheet on page K634 of the Appendix to evaluate the animal. The "normal, resting numbers" on this page can then be compared to the numbers recorded on the physical exam sheet. For help on the proper ways of obtaining the following information, refer to the pictures and captions in Section C of this manual. Table #2 is where medications and supplements can be recorded. Table #3 is where vaccinations and de-worming procedures can be recorded. Surgeries and problems can be recorded on table #4.
